CHICAGO, IL - - The Asian American Coalition of Chicago hosts its 28th Annual Lunar New Year Celebration, "One Vision, Many Voices" on Saturday, February 26, 2011 at the Hyatt Regency O'Hare, 9300 West Bryn Mawr Avenue in Rosemont. Reception, open microphone and exhibits begin at 5 p.m.; opening ceremonies are at 6:30 p.m., followed by dinner, entertainment, cultural program and awards ceremonies until approximately 10 p.m.

Every year a different Asian community takes turn playing host of the Lunar New Year gala. This year it is the **Indian American Community**, which has thrice before (1988, 1995 and 2003) held the gavel for the Asian Pacific American community's most important event of the year.

"This is the 28th Annual Asian American Coalition of Chicago Lunar New Year Celebration. The Indian American Community is honored to host this Gala once again, and I am humbled to serve as Chair," said Nadja P. Lalvani, 2011 Chair of the 28th Annual Asian American Coalition of Chicago Lunar New Year Celebration.

"This is a great opportunity for me to give back to the community that I've grown up in, and that has supported me," she continued. My vision is to build an even stronger Coalition among all the Asian American community. This is an opportunity for us to showcase the diversity and the unique characteristics of the Asian American community - in a big way, and to bring our community together. AWARDS

The Coalition plans to award its 2011 Community Service Awards, its Youth Who Excels Awards, its prestigious Pan Asian American Ping Tom Memorial Award - its highest award, and its Grand Asian American Sandra Otaka Memorial Award that evening.

The Coalition renamed its Pan Asian Award in 1996 after the late legendary Chicago civic leader Ping Tom. Ping Tom was also one of the original founders of the Asian American Coalition. The Grand Asian Award is traditionally given to a non-Asian Friend of the Asian American community. The Coalition renamed its Grand Asian Award in 2010 after the late Cook County Circuit Court Judge Sandra Otaka.

According to the latest Census, the Asian Pacific American population in Illinois numbers approximately 428,213, or 3.4% of the statewide population. Approximately 71,469 Asian Pacific Americans reside in DuPage County, comprising 7.9% of DuPage County's population, with the bulk of the other 262,731 residents of Cook County, comprising 4.8% of Cook County's population. The 2000 Census shows that Asian Pacific Americans reside in Chicago in communities including West Rogers Park, Albany Park, Uptown, Armour Square and Bridgeport, and in suburban Cook County in communities including Schaumburg, Hoffman Estates and Skokie.
